Voluntary Surveillance Camera Registration Program

The Brownwood Police Department is committed to providing excellent service to our citizens; to be effective we must use every available method at our disposal to solve crime. One of the most effective ways to solve crime is with evidence captured on video surveillance, and we are discovering that more and more of our residents are utilizing video surveillance systems on the exterior of their homes or businesses.

With recent successes in solving crimes by placing suspect photos on our Facebook page, local newspapers, Crime Stoppers bulletins, and local television news broadcasts, the Brownwood Police Department is initiating a program where citizens can register their exterior facing surveillance cameras with the police department in an effort to assist us in solving crimes.

When a crime occurs in the vicinity of a residence that has a registered camera, an investigator will make contact with the owner and ask permission to view their video in an attempt to identify the suspect or any suspicious activity. Knowledge of cameras in and around the city would save your police department valuable time during investigations and could help in apprehending criminals. It can also be used to locate lost children, elderly, or disabled persons. Participation in this program is completely voluntary and consent to view the video footage from your camera system could be withdrawn or declined at any time.
